Latest Guidance

As we have had several cases of Covid in school recently, please can I remind you that although there is now no legal requirement to self-isolate if you have COVID, we still have guidance in place. Please see the information below, from our latest Risk Assessment (which comes directly from LCC):

Staff and pupils are encouraged to follow safer behaviours including;

•staying at home if they are unwell

 taking a test if they have COVID-19 symptoms and staying at home and avoiding contact with other people if they test positive.

Staff and pupils who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people. After 5 days, they may choose to take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) followed by another the next day - if both are negative, and they do not have a temperature, they can safely return to school.
