This Week...

Welcome back and Happy New Year 2019! I hope that you all had a lovely Christmas. We have started the new term at a pace, with the recognition that we are all now familiar with Class 3 routines and have lots of new and exciting learning to do. Our new topic in Geography is Volcanoes and Earthquakes and our Science will focus on the human digestive system. We all wrote a recount of our holiday and it was so wonderful to read about new pets, books and adventures! The children were using conjunctions such as 'because' and 'although' to extend their sentences. We have also been doing a lot of reading to get the children back into the routine of regular reading and answering questions. In our Maths work, the children have been investigating 3D shape, using technical vocabulary such as faces, edges and vertices and looking carefully at the properties of each shape. In our RE this week we have started looking at 'Jesus the Teacher', and reflecting on our own experiences of learning and teaching others new things.
