Learning This Week

This week in Literacy, the children have been reading and analysing texts about a variety of different well known and respectable individuals in our new unit covering 'Biographies'. The children have been answering comprehension questions, recognising cohesive devices and identifying the features of a good biography.

In our maths work this week we have been looking at the properties of 3D shapes, investigating the nets of cubes as well as measuring and drawing angles in preparation for drawing our own accurate 2D shapes.

In RE the children have been studying the life journeys of Moses, Ruth, Daniel and Jacob from the Old Testament. We have been thinking about how their faith had an impact on them and their lives. Next week we will be considering what life would be like for a 'Super Christian'.

Learning Next Week

Next week we will continue to practise our times tables and develop our skills in mental and written subtraction. The children will also continue to read further biographies, analyse their structure and begin to gather research which will culminate in them writing their own biography.
