





LEARNING IN SCHOOL

English: We have switched our focus to Enid Blyton's novel 'The Magic Faraway Tree'. We spent a week generating fantastical vocabulary using thesauruses to expand our word banks. We described trees and amazing places. We have written diary entries as Joe the day after the Land of Topsy-Turvy, we have created our own fantasy characters and amazing lands. Both will feature next week in our own writing of a new chapter.

Maths: We have continued with our focus on Place Value. We have honed in on decimal numbers; ordering, comparing and rounding them. We also have rounded whole numbers.

Science: We have identified the properties of different materials and have tested the magnetic and electrical conductivity of different metals.
