





LEARNING IN SCHOOL

Since the last time I wrote to you, the Year 5 children enjoyed a fabulous residential visit to **Borwick Hall**. They shone their lights brightly as they battled through team and personal challenges. The Year 4 children completed some super work with Mrs Emptage surrounding the **Winter Olympics**.

English: We have begun our unit of historical fiction. We are using the Anglo Saxon story of Beowulf to apply lots of writing opportunities. We are really enjoying exploring the vocabulary used by Michael Morpurgo in his retelling.

Maths: The start of a half term means we refocus on Place Value. We have focussed on decimals – ordering them, rounding them, and finding fraction equivalents.

RE: We started thinking about Lent. We used Simon Smith's series of 40 images to explore Jesus' temptations in the wilderness. We then represented how Jesus might have felt by creating watercolour washes where the colours we chose reflected Jesus' emotions.

Science: We have started a unit about Forces. We explored gravity and debunked some myths. We also then investigated friction using some shoes and our class tables.

History: Starting our unit on Anglo Saxons, we used secondary sources to establish a timeline of that era of British history.

PE: We have begun our Net and Wall unit. We have focussed on a range of throwing techniques.
