This Week

This week, in **English**, we have created our own character from 'Aladdin and the Magic Lamp', planned our own versions and begun to write them using relative clauses. In **Maths**, we focussed on statistics and the retrieval of information from bar graphs, line graphs and timetables. In **Science**, we investigated friction and how it can be measured. We tested which of Mr B's shoes had the most friction then compared it with our own shoes. In **RE**, we focussed on Moses' mother, Jochebed, and her amazing tale of faith in a God who rules over all situations. In **History**, we researched about the House of Wisdom in the early Islamic Civilization of AD900 and how knowledge was of vital importance for that civilization.
