As predicted, the last two weeks have passed very quickly and the children are now less than 5 weeks away from the end of their time at Lea Endowed. If you look at the Key Dates you will see there is still much to do!

In the first week of this term, the Showcase was a great success - it was lovely to see so many parents working alongside their children to produce some impressive Oba masks by tooling foil.

Our English learning has continued to build on the children's knowledge of Charles Dickens. Was Fagin good, bad or in the middle? This question was answered in great detail by Class 5 through a balanced discussion last week. This week they have excelled in writing a guide to pickpocketing (sorry Mrs Seagrave!) from Dodger to Oliver. Every child had Dodger's voice – my favourite line has to be Jenson's, "Don't go 'round pickin' off poor people 'cause the only thing you'll find is a ticket to the gallows."

In Science we studied how light reflects off all objects so that we can see them. We then investigated how we could use mirrors to enable light to go round a corner. This required great teamwork and a good deal of patience setting the mirrors up.

Now we are focusing our efforts on speaking and listening skills through the Leaver' production. Every child in the class has lines to learn so any help with this is much appreciated. Maybe the children could say their words from the top of the stairs?!
