In total 114 schools were involved and a commemorative book has been sent to Buckingham Palace for the Queen to see. ## **ATTENDANCE**

Your child's daily school attendance is a legal requirement. This week, we have updated our Attendance Policy with the latest government requirements. I have attached this for your information.

Please note a few key points:

Queen Elizabeth

- Regular attenders make better progress, both socially and academically and find learning more satisfying and enjoyable.
- You must not take your child out of school for holidays, unless in exceptional circumstances.
- ❖ You must ensure your child is on time (before 9am) every day
- ❖ If attendance falls below 90%, your child has missed the equivalent of the whole of February.
- Missing one day a week for their whole time in school, would add up to missing the equivalent of two years' schooling.
