





This Week

In **English**, our focus on 'The Midnight Fox' has paused due to National Poetry Day (3rd October). We have spent the week exploring and diving deeper into a Cindy Wyatt poem called 'Jesus is the Light'. We have analysed the Christian themes of the poem, unpacked the vocabulary, created artwork in response and performed the poem in front of the whole school. In **Maths**, we have begun calculation work focussing on addition. In **RE**, we explored the structure of the Harvest service in the Church of England. In **History**, we explored (metaphorically but almost literally) the routes that significant Tudor sailors took as they sought to expand their horizons. In **Art**, we began to design our own buildings that feature common elements of Tudor housing. In **Computing**, we focussed on our communication online and how it needs to be kind and respectful. In **PE**, we continued with our passing skills, however due to the rain we applied these skills indoors. The Year 5 children practised the 'fraction stitch' (as named by the creators Faith and Evie) and French knots during their **DT** session at ACSC.

Sing Together

We started our Sing Together adventure this week. We had a visit from Geoff of the Blackburn Diocese Sing Together Team. We will have several visits throughout the year from different members of the team. We will work on the songs as part of our music curriculum. Our adventure culminates in a performance at King George's Hall in Blackburn on **Thursday 5**th **March 2020**.
