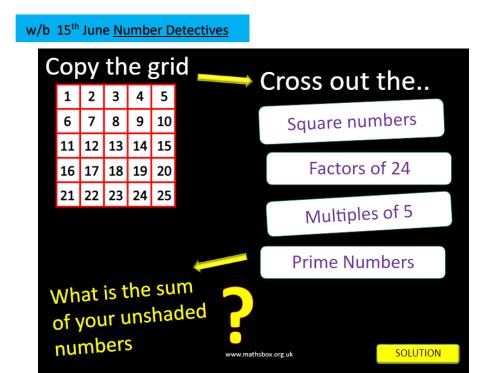

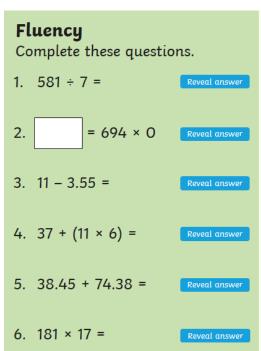

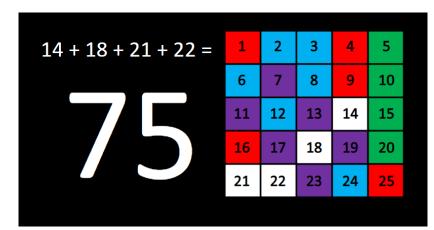

Any of these can be the odd one out as long as your reason is mathematical (e.g. ¾ because it is the only one with a digit in the hundredths column -0.75 or 0.4 because it is the only one written as a decimal)
