This week, we have completed some of our end-of-year assessments. The children have really worked hard to make as much progress as they could, particularly in a year disrupted by Lockdowns. Elsewhere in **English**, we have written our own versions of the Greek myth of Heracles. The children have produced some super variations. In **Maths**, we focussed on our confidence in using a written method for multiplication. In **RE**, we began to explore prayer as a concept. We looked at Jesus' example in the New Testament as well as Daniel and how he prioritised prayer. In **Science**, we conducted an investigation exploring if older people really are taller. In **PE**, we continued with our catching, throwing and striking skills before applying them in the context of rounders. In **History**, we investigated Ancient Greek life and tried to get a feel for what life would have been like if we had been alive in that era.
