a) Shade  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the bar model.

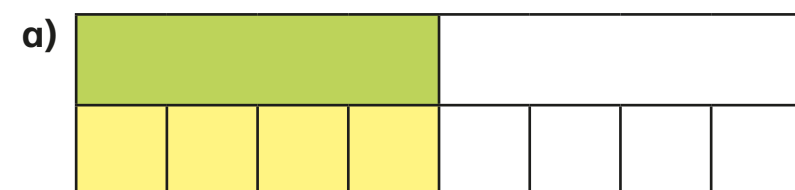


b) Shade  $\frac{2}{4}$  of the bar model.

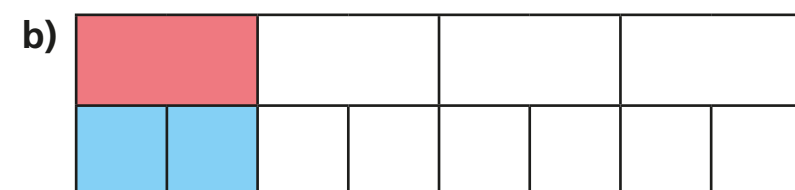

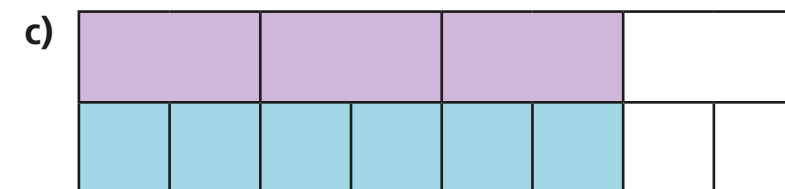

$$\frac{1}{4} = \frac{2}{8}$$

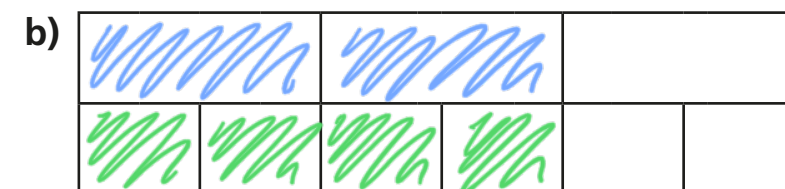


$$\frac{3}{4} = \frac{6}{8}$$

3 Shade the bar models to represent the equivalent fractions.



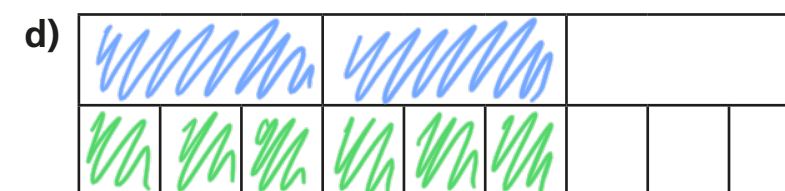
$$\frac{1}{3} = \frac{2}{6}$$

$$\frac{1}{3} = \frac{3}{9}$$

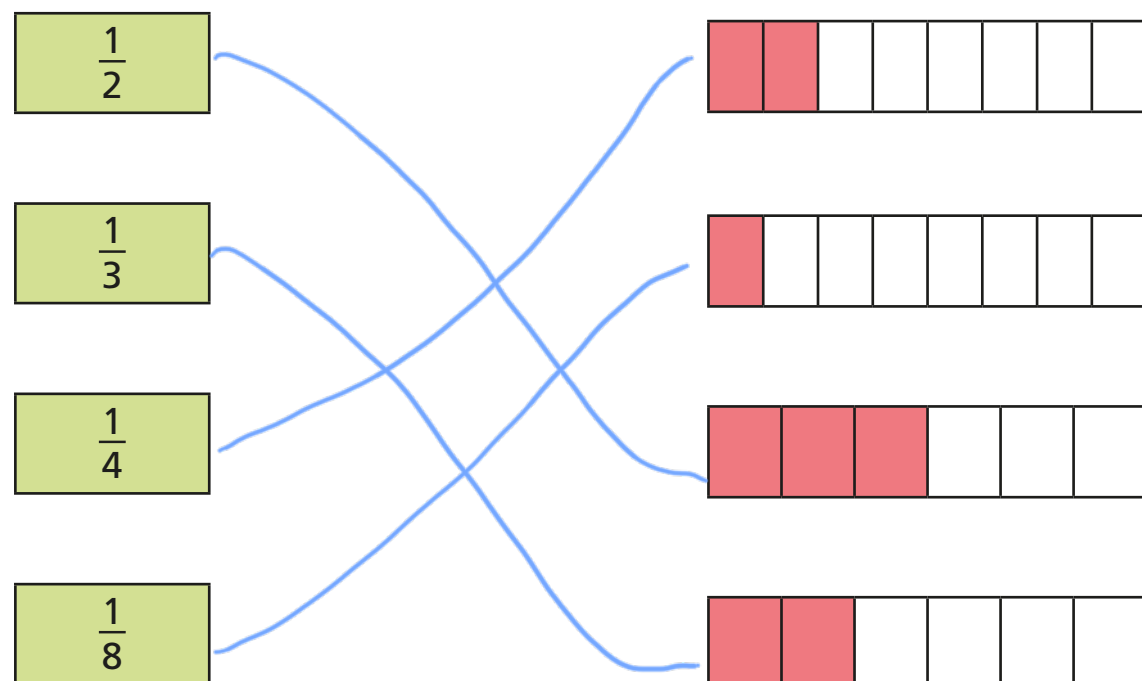
