#### Learning this Week - "Magnificent Me"

#### BISHOP'S HARVEST APPEAL

The children will then be able to buy each other's toys and can bring up to a maximum of £5 to spend at the sale. On Friday 11th October we are having a Rainbow of Hope dress up day. For a £1 donation, children can come dressed in any colour(s) of the rainbow- a wonderful symbol of Christian Hope. We are hoping to be able to make a human rainbow. The children also decided we will sell rainbow paper butterflies (50p each) in colours of the rainbow to make a Butterfly Rainbow, symbolising the transformational change we can make when we follow our school VISION, to Love God and Love others, I'm sure you will agree that the children's ideas are inspirational.
