**Mrs Seagrave's Good Manners and Respect Award**



**BISHOP'S HARVEST APPEAL**

It's that special time of year when we give thanks to God for the harvest, because we know how blessed we are to have a good supply of food. We also want to offer our prayers and gifts for those who are not so blessed as we are.

We are supporting this year's Bishop's Harvest Appeal, by raising money to help Friends of Mulanje Orphans (FOMO) bring hope to vulnerable children in Malawi, and help Christian Aid empower women in Honduras to take the lead in tackling climate change. As a Christian school we want to help bring positive CHANGE, DIGNITY and HOPE to our global neighbours. The Ethos group and Extra Milers came up with 3 ways to raise funds. They shared their ideas with the whole school, when they led our whole school worship this week, and were truly inspirational. On **Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> October** we are having a Harvest of Hope Toy Sale. We ask that the children bring in a toy(s) they are no longer playing with, or even ones they still love, as a real act of sacrificial love! The children will then be able to buy each other's toys -they can bring up to a maximum of £5 to spend at the sale. On **Friday 11<sup>th</sup> October** we are having a Rainbow of Hope dress up day. For a £1 donation, children can come dressed in any colour(s) of the rainbow- a wonderful symbol of Christian Hope. We are hoping to be able to make a human rainbow. The children also decided we will sell rainbow paper butterflies (50p each) in colours of the rainbow to make a Butterfly Rainbow, symbolising the transformational change we can make when we follow our school VISION, to Love God and Love others.
