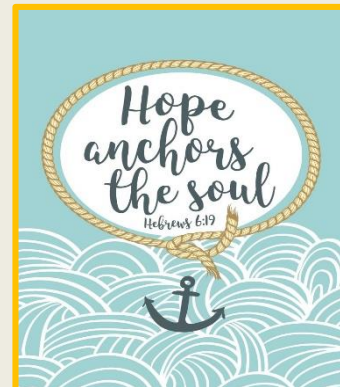

Parent Governor Vacancy

We have a vacancy for a Parent Governor. The role of the parent governor is to represent the parental perspective within the school's governing body, ensuring a parent's viewpoint is considered during important decision-making. They are not there to represent or influence parents or handle individual complaints, but rather to contribute to the school's vision, direction and policies, along with the rest of the governors.

Who can be a Parent Governor?

Anyone who has parental responsibility for a pupil on the school roll at the time of election can stand for election and can vote in the election. If this applies to you, you should have received the Parent Governor Election paperwork today. If you have not received this and are interested in voting or putting yourself forward for the role, please contact school.

What does the Role Require?

The role requires ensuring that our identity as a Church of England School is sustained in every area of its life and underpins its curriculum planning. It also involves taking an active interest in the education of our children, giving time to learn about the role by attending induction training , attending meetings throughout the year (usually in the evening but occasionally meetings have to take place during the school day), abiding by the Governors' Code of Conduct and respecting confidentiality, undergoing the pre-appointment checks including a DBS check, signing a Declaration of Eligibility form and completing a register of financial interest.
