LEARNING IN SCHOOL

English: We have really ramped up our writing over the past two weeks. We are now in the writing phase writing our own versions of 'Puss in Boots'.

Maths: Fractions have been on the menu. We have identified equivalent fractions, added and subtracted as well as identifying fractions greater than one.

RE: Our unit exploring Christmas in Matthew and Luke has helped us see the similarities and differences between their accounts. We have explored different children's Bibles seeing how the Nativity is portrayed in them and how they blend both gospel accounts.

Science: We have investigated thermal conductivity. We have conducted two investigations that have helped us see how thermal conductivity works. Hats and lids are the best way to keep us warm.

History: We have learned about the Egyptian Pharaohs and what their great accomplishments were. We have created pyramids in their style. We also have made our own versions of Egyptian pita bread, a water clock and played a game called Senet (this was very popular).
