## **BISHOP'S HARVEST APPEAL 2021**

This year our Harvest appeal is supporting the work of the Mosamaria Trust, a charity that works with those most in need in our link diocese of The Free State, South Africa. Their Orphans and Vulnerable Children programme looks after children who have been orphaned by the various illnesses associated with AIDS.

Mosamaria holds after school clubs which provide food and education for these children. Teaching through games and songs, they enrich school lessons and help with homework. They run sports programmes which are designed to develop leadership and teamwork skills while at the same time giving opportunity to discuss things as simple as good hygiene. Mosamaria supports and feeds some of the most vulnerable children in South Africa. On Friday 8<sup>th</sup> October, we are going to be having a special Harvest Celebration fundraising day where the children will be involved in planting bulbs, making paper prayer chains etc. We are aiming to raise enough funds to buy a new Wi-Fi modem or a bike for the trust to use.
