science - Light and Shadows

- Facts about light instil basic knowledge ready for investigation
- Recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light.
- What do shadows look like? Shadow puppets labelled diagrams based on shadow
- Recognise that shadows are formed when light is blocked by a solid object.
- Do shadows change? systematic and careful observation
- How do shadows change closer/further away children plan investigation with hypothesis, fair testing and conclusion written over two weeks
- Are bigger torches brighter comparison and recording in tables
- Find patterns in the way that the size of shadows can change
- Can light be moved? Use of mirrors children drawing on knowledge base learned so far.


