- Unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of gravity
- Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction
- These are all forces which slow down moving objects
- Recognise that some mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears allow smaller force to have greater effect
- There are different types of forces

Working scientifically –

- Designing and making a variety of parachutes
- Carrying out fair testing to determine which designs are the most effective
- Exploring resistance in water by making and testing boats of different shapes
