Learning this Week

This week in our **RE** studies, we have focused on the story of blind Bartimaeus.

In **Mathematics** lessons we have focused on money, coin values and making amounts of the same value in different ways. We have also been adding and subtracting using coins of the same value and calculated change.

In our **English** lessons we written our own new adventures for Mr Penguin.

Our **History** work has focused on Neil Armstrong and his achievements.

In our **Science** work we have continued looking at seasonal change. We have focused on the season of spring and enjoyed looking for signs of spring in our school grounds.
