HOME TASKS

Morning Task

<u>Reading</u>

Please read every day. Fill in your Reading Diary.

Reading Tasks

• Write what you know about the characters and how you know it using evidence from the text.

• Choose some unfamiliar words. What do you think they mean? Look them up. Write a sentence with them. can you list 3 synonyms and 3 antonyms for each word.

- Write a blurb for the book you are reading or our current Class Novel (There's a boy in the girls' bathroom)
- Write down 5 TRUE things about the book you are reading and 5 things that are FALSE
- Read a Non-Fiction book and write a Fact File about a topic that interests you.

<u>Maths</u>

Try and do a bit of Maths each day.

Maths Ideas

- Go to My Mini Maths https://myminimaths.co.uk/year-6-arithmetic-practice-papers/ (Scroll down and open an arithmetic paper) work through some of the questions then CHECK with the answers.

 - BAKE! Make a cake or biscuits. Measure the ingredients carefully and make notes of amounts and timings.
 - At different points of the day, work out what the time is. Use 12-hour and 24-hour digital.
 - Play a game: card games, board games (such as monopoly or snakes and ladders) or dominoes.



<u>Writing</u>

Try and do a bit of writing each day. Remember to write in paragraphs, full sentences, using correct spelling, grammar and punctuation.

Writing Tasks

- Keep a diary of your time off school.
- Write a letter to a local nursing or residential home and post it! Try to spread some happiness and cheer in your letter.
- Write a story, poem or a play.
- Choose a topic you are interested in and write an Information text about it.

Spelling

- Spend 5-10 minutes practising any unfamiliar spellings/ tricky words (there are lists of words you could use in our class area on the website!)
- Use different strategies there is a PowerPoint on our class area of the website with different strategies you could use.

<u>Times Tables</u>

Try and practise your Times Tables every other day

Ideas for Practising Times Tables

- Log on to Times Tables Rockstars and get faster in the 'studio' or have fun at the festivals!
- Ask someone at home to test your speed at times tables by asking you questions.
- *Choose a table you need to practise write it out and then check it with a calculator.*

SATs Revision

There are three 10-4-10 booklets in your pack – the idea is you do ten minutes of each booklet at a time while you are off school.

<u>Ten for Ten Maths Practice Booklet – 10 days worth!</u>

Use this booklet to do your 10 minutes practice per day and you'll be ready for action when you get back to school! Each day there are 6 arithmetic questions and a few reasoning questions. Try to do as much of the booklet as you can, remember it should take around 10 minutes each day.

<u>Reading Booklet – ten days worth!</u>

If you do a little bit of Reading every day it will keep things fresh in your mind when you come back to school. For each day there are some Reading texts and questions, and a couple of SATs style questions. Try to do as much of the booklet as you can, remember it should take around 10 minutes each time you attempt a set of questions.

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Booket - ten days worth!

Doing a bit of Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling every day it will keep things fresh in your mind for when you come back to school. Each day has 10 questions for you to complete. Try to do as much of the booklet as you can, remember it should take around 10 minutes each day.

Science

Our new topic is "Living Things and Animals including Humans"

- Make your own word search using the following words: heart, heartbeat, pulse, muscle, blood vessel, blood, lung, oxygen, carbondioxide, circulate, organ, diet, exercise, drugs, lifestyle, harmful, healthy, damaged, nutrients, water, transported, substances.
- Find out the meanings of the words above and use a dictionary or 'word hippo' online to write a definition for each. Use this to create a glossary (remember it should be written in alphabetical order).
- Use the internet to research these questions:
 - 1) What is 'pulse rate'?
 - 2) Why do we have lungs? Why do we have a heart? How do our hearts and lungs work together to keep us alive?
 - 3) Why does our heart beat faster and our breathing increase when we exercise?
 - 4) Do different types of exercise affect our heart in different ways? Which types of exercise are better for our heart?
- Find out about different types of animals mammals, reptiles, amphibians, fish and birds (What is special about each type).
- Choose an animal to research create a poster about it (include key information such as animal type, appearance, habitat, diet, size, babies, conservation status and any interesting facts).



<u>R.E</u>

- Do a random acts of kindness -send a postcard to an elderly neighbour giving them an encouraging Christian message or write a prayer for them.
- Explore the artwork of Hannah Dunnett online and create your own version of an Easter piece of art.
- Design an Easter card showing the true meaning of Easter. Think about which symbols you might use, colours, words etc. (The internet has great ideas which you could adapt).
- Write a poem entitled 'Who is Jesus?'
- Design a Lea Endowed Poster that shows our Christian Values use drawings and symbols.

<u>Geography</u> Our current topic is 'Natural Disasters'

- The Indian Ocean tsunami of 2004 was the worst tsunami in recent years. Find out as much as you can about it, then answer these questions:
- 1) What caused this tsunami?
- 2) What date did it take place?
- 3) Where did it take place?
- 4) Where was the epicentre of the earthquake that caused the tsunami?
- 5) Which countries were affected by the tsunami?
- 6) How did the tsunami affect the landscape?
- 7) How did it affect the people?
- 8) What made this tsunami one of the most devastating in recent times?
- 9) What was done to try and rebuild the places affected by the tsunami?
- Draw and label a picture an erupting volcano
- Research a famous volcano design an information poster about it (include key facts and statistics).

<u>P.E.</u>

- Get out in the garden! Run on the spot, do star jumps, skip etc... Time yourself! See how many you can do in a minute or longer.
- Search for 'Just Dance' videos on YouTube and give them a go!
- If it's safe to do so, go for a nice long walk with someone in your family.
