BIBLE READING - John 15: 9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Two sides of the same coin



We find our meaning in life through our relationships. Humans are relational creatures. Christians think about this in terms of our relationship with God, and our relationship with other people. This is at the heart of Jesus' two great commandments – 'love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength' and 'love your neighbour as yourself.'


As Jesus continues with his image of the vine and the branches, we see that loving God and loving other people are closely intertwined. We might say that they are 'two sides of the same coin.' If we obey Jesus' commandments we will abide in his love, and his command is simply this – that we 'love one another as he has loved us.' We therefore dwell in Jesus' love as we love other people, and vice versa.



Loving others brings us closer to Jesus


I know from my own experience that when I have practised love and kindness towards family, friends, neighbours, and strangers, I can come to Jesus in prayer with greater confidence. It feels good to do good,

and we feel closer to God when we have loved our neighbours as ourselves.



We can of course still come before Jesus when we have fallen short of this, in which case we may have a few things to discuss with him! But fundamentally, if we want to stay connected to the vine and bear the fruit of the Holy Spirit, then we need to love others. When we live a life of love towards other people, Jesus tells us that we can relate to him as a friend. Those who show love towards others are friends of God. What more could we wish for?

The Source of true Joy



The first disciples must have looked at Jesus and wondered whether they could ever know the kind of relationship with God that he had. Jesus tells them that they can! If they keep his commandments, and abide in his love, then they will experience the same kind of intimate friendship that Jesus' had with His heavenly Father. Jesus wants his followers to discover this, to experience it for ourselves, so that we too may feel the same joy that was in Christ Jesus. 'I have said these things to you so that

my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.'

What a wonderful metaphor Jesus gives us. I don't know about you but I want to remain in the vine, enjoy Jesus' love, bear the fruit of the Holy Spirit, love other people, and experience all the joy that follows.s
