In English this week, we have begun to use Enid Blyton's novel 'The Magic Faraway Tree' as our class novel. We have explored the language she uses, written diary entries as one of the characters, as well as planning to create our own resident of the Faraway Tree. In Maths, in Place Value, we have ordered, compared and rounded numbers. We are beginning to be able to explain why certain aspects of Maths happen. In RE, we were able to handle almost 30 different Bibles, seeing which we liked and exploring their different purposes. In Science, we improved our designs from last week and set up further tests this week to see if we could protect an egg from smashing. The Year 5's also went to Ashton. In Geography, we began to identify if food was natural or man-made. In PE, we had the first of six sessions with Michael from PNE, who is working with us on our Net & Wall skills. The Year 5's also went swimming. In French, we recapped simple greetings. In Music, we continued with our glockenspiel unit.
