This week, the children have been learning about the new Preston Western Distributor Road. We went outside school to view for ourselves the construction process and the children were genuinely shocked to see the destruction of trees over the road as well as hearing the noise, seeing the dust and thinking about the impact on our local community. We watched drone footage of the work to date and read some public inquiry notes to develop pros and cons for the road in preparation for our second debate. The children are very passionate when speaking out! We have been tackling formal written methods of multiplication and division in our Maths and the children are really increasing in confidence when using a range of strategies. Our Science/PHSE focused on drugs and the class were specifically learning about county lines – we read some case studies and discussed the matter of grooming. We have started our new History unit on the Swinging 60's and we have all related to the disciple Peter during our RE lesson. It is lovely to see the year 6's really growing in independence; some children are now walking to school, others catching the bus and some coming by bike. Please continue talking to your child about the importance of remaining on the pavement and not going out into the road to avoid other pedestrians etc – the roads around school are VERY busy, especially at the moment with all the road works.


of participation and skill was outstanding!
