**Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> November – Parents' Evening-** 3:30-5pm and 6-7pm

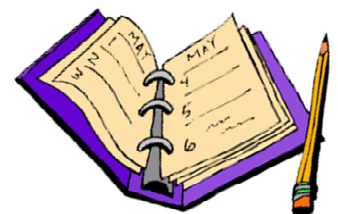
