#### This Week...

This will be the last newsletter for this half term. This week in English, we have been developing our note taking skills in order to prepare for writing an information article next week. Maths has focused on strengthening our addition skills by using formal methods of addition and applying these strategies into context. In Geography, the children learned how to calculate scale looking at the length of different rivers across the UK. In Music we played a range of games to help us find the pulse/beat of a piece of music, as well as discussing some new technical vocabulary. French lessons have continued to focus on key phrases and greetings as well as learning numbers in French.
