Since Christmas is a time when families share and pass on traditions, there is a little story that “tells” why this plant has become a “regular” feature. The story goes like this:

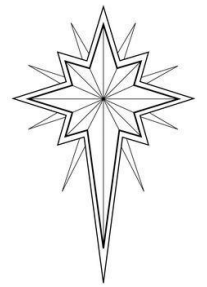
