Welcome to our Spring 1 Round-Up Newsletter. We have been very busy in school, learning many new things and enjoying spending time with our friends and wider school family. Here is just a taste of what we have all been up to!

Reception

This half term has been a very busy one in Reception. We have been learning about the stories that Jesus would have listened to when he was a little boy. We have shared some stories from the Old Testament - Daniel in the Lion's Den, Jonah and the Whale, Noah's Ark and Joseph the Dreamer. In Literacy, we have looked at traditional tales and popular stories, and are learning how to write simple words independently. We have learned all the Reception phonemes and are now building up our recognition of tricky words. We have learned how to read two-syllable words using the 'chunking method'. In Maths, we have explored numbers to 8, learning that each number can be made in a variety of ways, eg 4 + 4 and 5 + 3 both add up to 8. We have begun to understand that we live on planet Earth and that it moves around the sun. We used inflatable balls and torches to explore how day and night happen. We have loved exploring our city of Preston, and the Preston in Australia using Google Earth. We were very excited to zoom in on school and spot Mrs Ramsay striding across the playground! It was lovely to finish the half term with our Reception Showcase. Thank you to everyone for your support; the children had a wonderful time sharing their learning with you! Year 1

We all enjoyed our NSPCC Number Day and did a variety of fun tasks related to numbers.

In our Science, we have been learning all about Earth and Space. We have found out about the movement of the Earth in relation to the Sun and learned many facts about the Moon when we did our outdoor Moon Walk Quiz.
