### Please note...

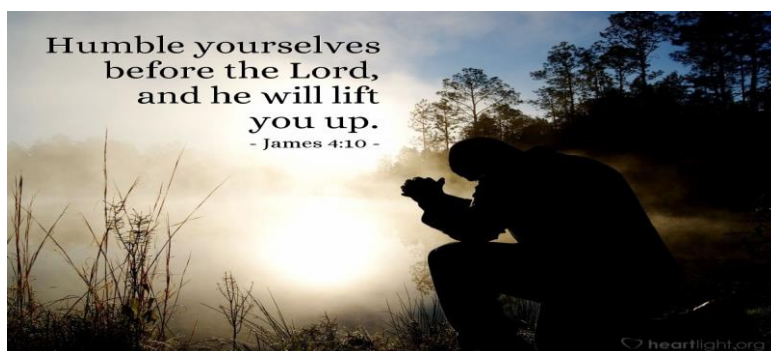
