May I take this opportunity to thank you all for your support this term – it means a great deal. I hope you all have a lovely break with some spring sunshine thrown in too!

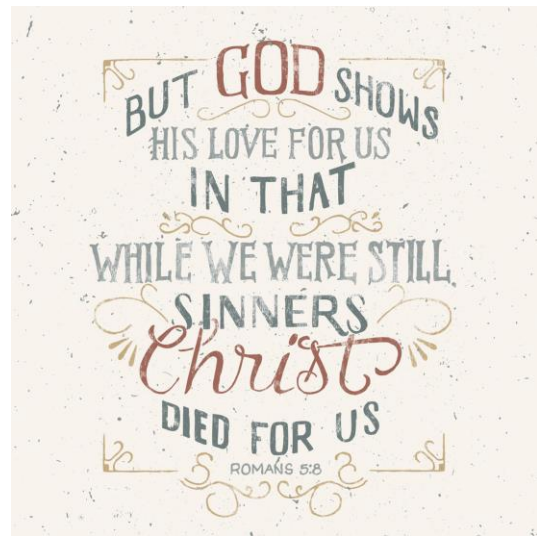


### News!
