This Week

This week, in **English**, we have continued 'Aladdin and the Magic Lamp' as our source text but our genre of focus of play scripts. We have explored the features of the genre, identified stage directions, followed them and have designed our own scenes. Our focus in **Maths** has been on identifying the area, perimeter and volume of 2D and 3D shapes. In **Science**, our investigation on pulleys didn't work out as well as we'd liked with the pulleys we were using often failing in holding the moving string so we applied the scientific method to work out how we could fix this issue for next weeks lesson. In **RE**, we put ourselves in the shoes of the silent women of the bible: Miriam, Mrs Noah, The Innkeeper's wife, Mary on Easter morning. In **History**, we explored the religious aspects of the Islamic Golden Age. In **Computing**, we began a unit on using PowerPoint, using the various presentation features at our disposal.

Class 4 Summer 2 Half-term Homework Project

In History, this term, we have been exploring the Islamic Golden Age circa 900^{AD}. There was a lot of scientific advancement during this period. Your homework project is to research and create a written project (NOT A POWERPOINT PRESENTATION), exploring another era of scientific advancement. You can use websites, library books and other sources to help you! It should ALL be your own work! Each week there is a new task for you to complete to help manage your workload.

The project should be handed in on Monday 15th July.

The children will then present their projects to the class during that week. There will be 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prizes as well as some projects being marked highly commended. Projects will be judged on effort, presentation, content and consistency.

You can choose from ONE of the following eras:

- European Renaissance (14th to 17th Centuries) .
 - The Enlightenment (17th to 18th Centuries)
- US and/or British Industrial Age (18th to 19th Centuries)

Week One (w/b 10th June)

Choose one of the eras of development and create a front cover for your project. You MUST include:

the title (the era you have chosen); your name; any suitable keywords and/or images

Week Two (w/b 17th June)

Complete ALL of the following tasks:

- create a timeline for your era (include significant inventions/discoveries/deaths etc.); and
- create a fact file about one significant individual from this era (including at least 10 facts).
