This week, the children have been busy doing a lot of different Writing. I am really impressed with how the Writing from all the children is progressing – we have children in Class 3 who are neater writers that I am, and many of the children are proficient in writing interesting information at length. I am very proud! In our Maths, we have been focusing on different strategies for solving addition and subtraction calculations. The children have been revising both mental and formal written methods and applying these to measurement. We investigated the fossilisation process in Science; we even got to handle a fossilised ammonite. Miss Wilson

had a fantastic afternoon of athletics and PHSE on Tuesday, and Mrs Morris is working on all things volcanoes in our Geography and DT project this half term. Exciting stuff!

Not only does Reading allow children to experience different cultures, empathise with different characters and 'escape' to fantastical places, it also helps immeasurably with their understanding of the whole curriculum from reading Maths

problems to interpreting charts and graphs in Science to researching Egyptians in History!
