





This Week

This week, some of the children have struggled to listen and maintain focus throughout large sections of the day. I would ask that you ensure the children are well rested and get to bed at a sensible time so that they are able to fully achieve their potential, rather than battle against tiredness and inappropriate behaviour. In English, we have begun a biography unit looking at the life of Benjamin Zephaniah, the British poet. We have explored some of the grammatical features of the unit including writing in the past tense, using pronouns and adverb phrases. In Maths, we have used a shorter written method for multiplication. This took some getting used to but the children have really taken to it well. In Science, we continued looking at the human body and conducted an investigation into our heights, then produced a graph to represent the data. In Geography, we used instructions to follow road maps, identifying different categories of road, as well as left and rights. In PE, we continued developing our partner balances and learned the words to the All Black Maori Haka 'Ka Mate'. In Computing, we continued coding our game. In DT, we tasted a wide variety of food from the Eat Well Pyramid.
