


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## **Maths**



Make a model and/or create a fact file about each of them.



This half term we will be looking at the work of the artist Kandinsky. Look at the slides with the Home Learning plan and find out who Wassily Kandinsky was.

Why was music important to him?

# **Dance**

#### **Lion Freeze**

Pretend to be a lion. Play some music and dance. When the music stops, see if you can freeze like a lion. How many lion poses can you do?



How might a lion move? Can you stalk (sneak up quietly), run, jump and leap like a lion? Ask someone to yell out 'chase', 'stalk' or 'freeze'. Move like a lion, listening out for the instruction – you should then move faster, slower or stop and freeze.

# **Copy that Move**

Choose someone to play with. Take it in turns to do a lion/cat move, then teach your partner. Can you get your moves identical?

#### **Lion Moves**

Work with someone to create a list of ways lions move. Think of a move for each one. Play some music and shout out each action.

- Everyone dances differently. Do what works for you!
- Tell everyone how good they are.
- Dance to different songs from the Lion King.
