In class, over the past 2 weeks, we have been busy starting our new units of work. The children have loved getting to grips with the historical vocabulary from The Stone Age - ask your child about the Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic Eras and how things changed during this time! In maths, we have been looking at time and converting units of time, as well as converting between analogue and digital time. In English, we have started our new class novel; The Wild Way Home by Sophie Kirtley. Class 4 have been writing some fantastic descriptions of the woodland within Mandel Forest and have planned their own free verse poem! In RE, we have been thinking about the Ten Commandments and their importance even now, in 2025.
