This week we have been getting to know each other. The children have been showing me their Mathematical abilities and we have been writing about Antarctica and what it means to be a Christian person. We have also begun group reading sessions and the children have been recoding their thoughts about books they've read in their Reading Journals. Additionally, we have been reading the end of our Class Novel: Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo. The children have also been researching influential characters as part of the celebrations of 'Black History Month'. In Geography, we have been finding out about longitude and latitude and using this knowledge to locate places on our Earth. We have also talked about the ever important subject of online safety; the children have been sharing their knowledge about how to stay safe online!
