We are Word Detectives



This week in class our **English** work has linked to the story "The Pirates of Scurvy Sands" by Jonny Duddle. We have also been exploring noun phrases and using 'and' to connect two sentences in our grammar work.

In **Mathematics** we will continued focusing on measurement and compared masses. We have also begun looking at the addition of two two-digit numbers and the strategies that we can use to solve them.

Mrs Pantlin, our school cook, visited the class this week during our **Science** lesson to talk to the children about her role preparing healthy, balanced school meals and answer questions prepared by the children.
