## This Week

This week in Maths, we have focussed on telling the time in analogue, digital (both 12-hour and 24-hour) and reading information from timetables. In English, we have continued with our newspaper genre writing, producing our own articles about the Nepal earthquake in 2015. In Geography, we have applied our understanding of earthquakes and volcanoes to understanding how tectonic plates affect their occurrence. In RE, we rewrote parables that Jesus taught, setting them in the modern day. In Science, we applied our understanding of teeth to the wider animal kingdom. We used our knowledge to identify carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. In PE, the Year 5 children have gone swimming (this changes after half term).
