

It's been an extra exciting week in school for those Deep and Wide learning experiences. Over the last two weeks we have faced some significant challenges with numerous staff absences however we have worked hard to protect face to face learning for the children and keep our classes open. I would like to thank the staff, for their extra efforts in supporting this. We continue to work hard to help the children catch up with lost learning. One of the most valuable ways you can support your child's progress in **ALL** subjects, is to listen to them read at least 5 times a week and sign their Reading record to inform the staff of progress at home.

Important Reminders

- **The school registers are taken at 9:00am** – Please allow extra time (with traffic lights & roadworks) to get your child to school before the official school day starts at 9:00am. **Children arriving after 9:00am will receive a late mark. After the register closes, they will receive an unauthorised attendance.** The teachers provide Morning Work from 8:45am each day to allow for a smooth transition into the school day and a prompt start to the Day's Learning.
