In English this week, we have continued using 'The Magic Faraway Tree' as our main text. We have focussed quite heavily on using speech punctuation, ensuring it is punctuated correctly. This will help us begin to write using description, action and speech. In Maths, our focus has progressed onto addition and subtraction. We have solidified our understanding of written methods for calculating and then have begun to apply this further. In RE, using verses from the Bible, we created some wonderful pieces of art. In Science, we sought to answer the question 'Are all metals magnetic?' We explored a variety of magnets and metallic objects and then presented our findings using role play and drama. The Year 5's also went to Ashton; this week we explored physical and chemical changes. We also had our first visit from the Sing Together team. We learned four new songs, some of them had fun actions and others used British Sign Language. We are looking forward to learning these in more depth.
