Do the activities that Lisa suggest; looking carefully at a real bird or finding a picture of a bird on the internet or in a book.

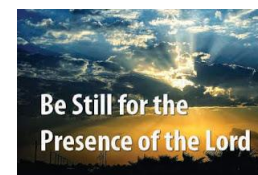
Draw the bird and, as you are drawing it, say a prayer to God, giving thanks for his wonderful creation.
