### This Week

What a fantastic day we had yesterday for our 'Choose Love' day supporting the Help Refugees charity. The children have written messages of love and hope as well as prayers for the refugees, which we have turned into a hot air balloon. We also enjoyed a variety of activities - thank you for your generosity. In **English**, we wrote our own independent poem based on Revolting Rhymes.
